https://www.rileyblakedesigns.com/pattern-updates for any revisions before starting this project. This pattern requires a basic knowledge of quilting technique and terminology. The quilt and block diagrams portrayed are virtual images. The layout and look of your project may differ when using actual fabric. Yardage calculated using a 42" usable width of fabric.

WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

HST = Half Square Triangle

SNF = Stitch and Flip

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

All fabrics are from Day in the Life unless otherwise indicated.

- (2) Day in the Life 5-inch Stackers (5-13660-42)
- (1) fat eighth of a Day in the Life print of your choice
- 1 yard Day in the Life Lipstick Grid (C13666-LIPSTICK)*
- *includes Binding
- 1 % yards Aqua Pin Dot (C705-AQUA)
- 2 1/2 yards WIDEBACK backing fabric of your choice

OTHER SLIPPLIES

Basic Sewing Supplies Batting (59" x 74 3/4")

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Please read all pattern instructions before cutting fabrics. Refer to the quilt photo for the placement of each of the fabrics. Use a straight edge ruler and rotary cutter to cut your fabrics.



Day in the Life 5-Inch Stacker

From (8) assorted squares cut:

- (6) 2 3/4" x 2 3/4" squares, label as A
- (2) 2 ¾" x 5" rectangles, label as B



Day in the Life Fat Eighth

Cut (3) 5" x 5" squares to add to Stackers selection



Day in the Life Lipstick Grid

Cut (3) 5" x WOF strips, subcut:

- (1) 5" x 23" strip
- (1) 5" x 14" strip
- (9) 5" x 5" squares, label as C

Cut (1) 2 3/4" x WOF strip, subcut:

- (3) 5" x 2 ¾" rectangles, label as D
- (6) 2 ¾" x 2 ¾" squares, label as E
- Cut (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for binding.

Aqua Pin Dot

Cut (3) 5" x WOF strips, subcut:

- (2) 5" x 14" strips
- (2) 5" x 9 ½" rectangles
- (10) 5" x 5" squares, label as F

Cut (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips, subcut:

- (2) 2 ³/₄" x 18 ¹/₂" strips
- (2) 2 ¾" x 2 ¾" squares, label as G

Cut (6) 5 ½" x WOF strips for borders

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Refer to the quilt diagram on page 4 for placement of the prints.

BLOCK ASSEMBLY

Block construction is described first, followed by the fabric combinations required to make specific blocks.

Flying Geese Instructions (labeled as FG on quilt diagram)

You will need:

- (2) A squares
- (1) B rectangle

1. Draw a diagonal pencil line corner to corner on the back of each square. Position a square at one end of the rectangle and stitch on the pencil line.



- 2. Trim ¼" away from the stitching, flip the triangle open and press.
- 3. Repeat Steps 2-3 with the second square on the opposite end of the rectangle. You will end up with a Flying Geese block the same size as the original rectangle.





4. Make (3) Flying Geese blocks using the following fabric combinations:

Heart Bottom Point

- (2) A squares (same print if desired)
- (2) D rectangles

Add D rectangle to top of Flying Geese to make a

5" x 5" block.



Heart Top Center

- (2) E squares
- (1) B rectangle
- (1) D rectangle

Add D rectangle to bottom of Flying Geese to make a

5" x 5" block.



Roof Top

- (1) B rectangle
- (2) G squares

Flying Geese block is 2 3/4" x 5".



Half-Square Triangle Instructions (labeled as HST on quilt diagram)

You will need:

- (1) 5" Stacker square
- (1) F square

- 5. Draw a diagonal pencil line corner to corner on the back of (1) square. Layer the squares and stitch on the pencil line.
- 6. Trim away one side $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the stitching. Flip open and press seam allowances to the darker side. Block should measure 5" x 5".





7. Make (10) HSTs using the following fabric combinations:

Heart

Make (2) with:

- (1) Stacker square
- (1) C square

Roof

Make (8) with:

- (1) Stacker square
- (1) F square

Stitch-and-Flip Corner Block Instructions (labeled as **SNF** on quilt diagram)

You will need:

- (1) Stacker square
- (1) E square
- 8. Draw a diagonal pencil line corner to corner on the back of the E square. If you use a directional print and want the design of the Stacker square to be right side up, be mindful of the block's position in the quilt. Position the smaller square RST on one corner of the Stacker square. Notice the line connects (2) adjacent sides of the larger square. Stitch on the pencil line.
- 9. Trim $\frac{1}{2}$ " away from the stitching, flip the corner open and press. You will be able to rotate the block to orient the corner triangle where you need it.





10. Make (8) SNFs using the following fabric combinations:

Heart

Make (4) with:

- (1) A square
- (1) C square

Make (4) with:


- (1) Stacker square
- (1) E square

QUILT ASSEMBLY

- 11. Layout the pieces and blocks as shown in the Quilt Layout Diagram below. The sizes shown are unfinished sizes. Assemble each row first. Then, sew the rows together to complete the quilt center. Quilt Center size: 41" x 56 ¾"
- 12. Sew border strips together end to end in one long strip.
- 13. The border measurements shown are suggested sizes. Measure your quilt vertically through the middle and cut (2) side borders to that measurement. Sew one to each side.

14. Repeat Step 3 for the top and bottom borders, this time measuring horizontally through the middle. Finished quilt size is 51" x 66 3/4".

FINISHING INSTRUCTIONS

Finish quilt by layering the quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste quilt layers together and quilt as desired. Bind with the Day on the Life Lipstick Grid strips.
