


1/2 yd each for Front, Backing & Batting 1 Fat Quarter for Borders Fusible Web for Borders Binding - 2 strips






Centerpiece Instructions

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS & PREPARATION

- Double sided fusible product is required when following the Westalee Design TempLee technique in this project. (TempLee-Fuse or a similar product is suggested.)
- Cut fabrics for each section and ID each as shown below.

Centerpiece Instructions


STEP 1

• Layer together Backing fabric and Batting layer. Lightly spray baste if desired. Set aside.

BACKING & BATTING LAYERS
Baste together

STEP 2

- Attach border strips to Top Layer "A" following arrows.
- Press seams toward borders.
- Apply double-sided fusible to wrong side.
- **Do Not Press** after protective sheet is removed until all stitching and cutting is completed.



STEP 3

- Apply double-sided fusible to wrong side of 2nd Accent Layer B small rectangle units.
- Remove protective sheets.
- Do Not Press once protective sheets are removed



STEP 4

- Position 2nd Accent Layer B small rectangle units onto top of 1st Accent Layer A as shown.
- · Use pin to temporarily hold in place briefly.
- Do Not Press once protective sheet is removed.



STEP 5 - PREPARE FOR STITCHING

- Carefully center onto Batting side of Backing unit.
- Position Top Layer onto the 1st Accent Layer with small rectangles still pinned in place.
- (Lightly mark these locations onto Top Layer if needed for location identification to be certain that PUZZLE stitch pattern is fully within the edges of this unit.)
- Relocate pins to outside to keep the small rectangles from slipping during handling.
- Do Not Press once protective sheets are

Handle carefully when moving until stitched to avoid slippage of fabric sections inside quilting unit.

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
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

Design Development & Stitching

STEP 6

- For alignment, lightly mark both vertical and horizontal centering lines using short dash marks. Mark a 3" grid pattern beginning at center marking outward toward the borders. Use the DMQuilting Basic Marker for accurate measuring and marking the grid.
- Stitch PUZZLE patterns (A, B, C) on the small rectangle units shown below. Be certain
 to center the template over the area where the small rectangles are positioned before
 stitching those areas.
- Do Not cut away or press until all stitching is complete.






• Posit

• Position 3.5"x5" PUZZLE Template to stitch the layout below. Follow the Template Instruction for placment ease using the method most comfortable.

DO NOT cut away or press until all stitching is complete.



STEP 8


- With all patterns stitched, follow the Westalee Design technique for TempLee Quilting and remove the top layer patterns as desired.
- Remove both the top and second layers to expose the 2nd ACCENT "B" for the small rectangle units to provide secondary fabric coloration.
- Once all removal cutting is complete, press all units together to fuse the entire piece. Trim and add binding to complete this project. Refer to cover photo as needed.



DMQuilting PUZZLE Template Set is used to create these unique design elements for a fascinating New Table Runner.

Fabric Requirements

1/2 yd each for Front, Backing & Batting 1 Fat Quarter for Borders Fusible Web for Borders Binding - 2 strips

Table Runner Instructions




- Cut fabrics for each section and ID each as shown.
- For Binding, use 2 strips of any fabric.
- Double sided fusible product is required when following the Westalee Design TempLee technique in this project. (Pellon Wonder-Under #805, Steam-a-seam light or similar product is suggested.) Only the BORDER LAYERS have the fusible product applied.

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Center Unit #1

17" wide


2nd Pattern

The larger **DMQuilting PUZZLE 3.5" x 5" Template** is used to create these unique design elements for the Center Unit of the Table Runner. See instructions below to stitch your fascinating new project which is sure to bring interest at your next gathering.

<u>STEP 1</u>

Complete markings on Center Unit for a total of 10 pattern elements as indicated on previous page. (Adjust pattern amounts to your liking if desired.)


- At each element location, use the 8-Pt Crosshair to mark for 8 rotations approximately 6.5" in diameter each.
- Refer to Pattern Diagrams below for template placement and stitching sequence for the rotations. Begin at the RED *, the GREEN ARROW \$ shows path for Travel Stitching to stop at the X.





3rd Pattern




Ath Pattern
