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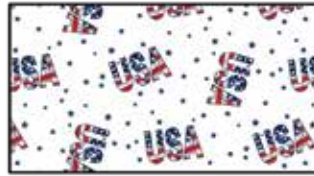

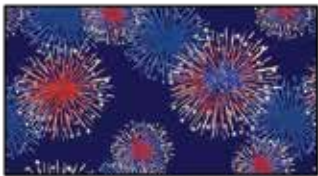

### Materials

2/3 yard (0.61m)	Blocks - 24 in x 44 in - Blue/Multi (A)	1544-78
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Tossed Small Stars - Navy/White (B)	1541-70
1/4 yard (0.23m)	Packed Flag - Blue/Multi (C)	1540-78
3/4 yard (0.69m)	Tossed Small Stars - Red/White (D)	1541-80*
1/2 yard (0.46m)	USA Tossed - White/Multi (E)	1535-07
1/2 yard (0.46m)	Fireworks - Blue (F)	1537-78
2/3 yard (0.61m)	Tossed Small Stars - Pigment White (G)	1541-01
3/8 yards (0.34m)	Tossed Stars - Red (H)	1534-87
2 yards (1.83m)	Border Stripe - Blue/Multi (I)	1542-78
4 yards (3.66m)	Pinwheel - White/Multi (Backing)	1539-07

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Blocks 24 in x 44 in – Blue/Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 1/2" squares, centered on blocks.

#### From the Tossed Small Stars – Navy/White (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 1/2" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 1/2" strips.

#### From the Packed Flag – Blue/Multi (C), cut:

- (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Small Stars – Red/White (D), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" squares.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the USA Tossed – White/Multi (E), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Fireworks – Blue (F), cut:

- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Small Stars – Pigment White (G), cut:

- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Tossed Stars – Red (H), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 1/2" WOF strips.

#### From the Border Stripe – Blue/Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 65" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 5 1/2" x 53" LOF strips.

#### From the Pinwheel – White/Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 69" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 57" back.

### Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 10 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 13 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2". Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

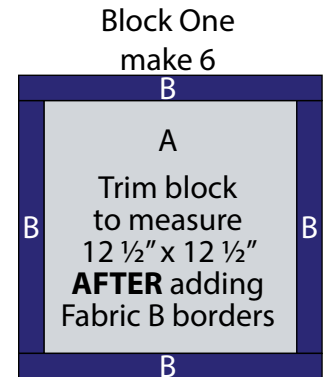

2. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 3).

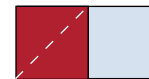

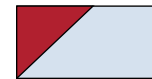

3. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).

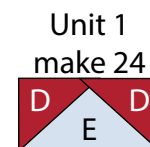

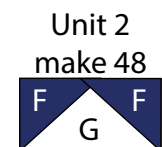

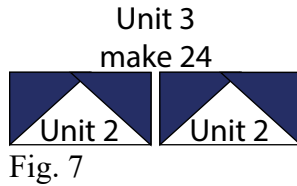
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (48) Unit 2 strips.

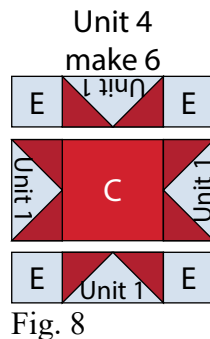

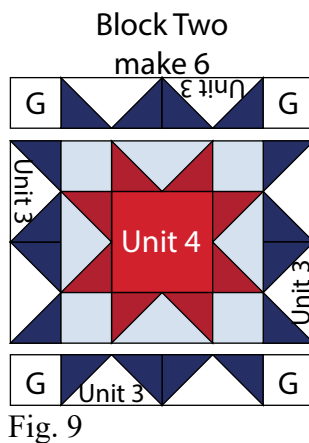
6. Sew (2) Unit 2 strips together end to end to make (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 3 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.



7. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1)  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 4 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (6) Unit 4 squares total.



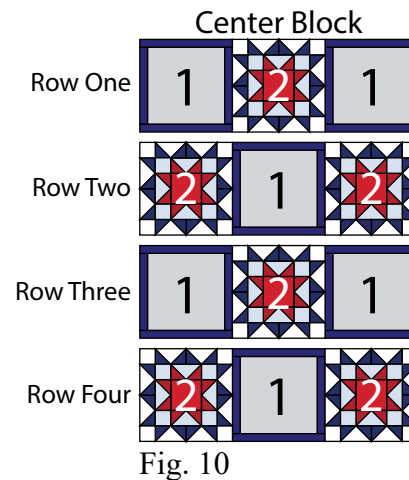
8. Sew (1)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Block Two square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.



9. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 10). Repeat to make Row Three.

10. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 10). Repeat to make Row Four.

11. Sew together the (4) pieced Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from the top to the bottom, to make the  $36\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 10).



### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

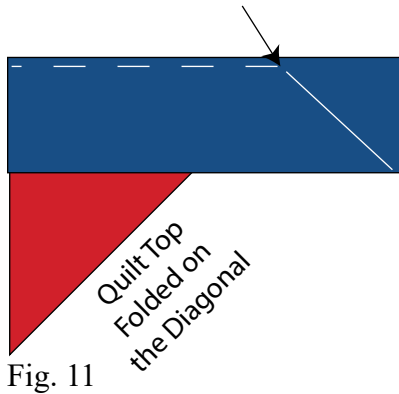
12. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $39\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

13. Center (1)  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $65$ " Fabric I strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1)  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $53$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).

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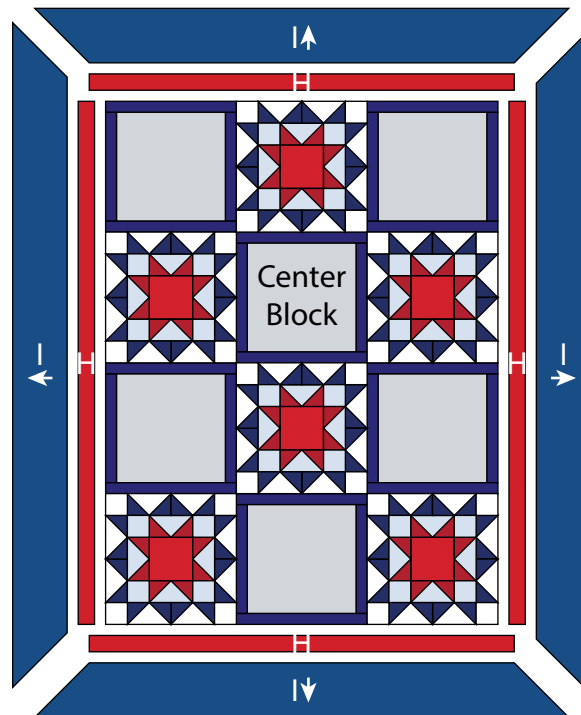
15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



16. Layer and quilt as desired.

17. Sew the (6) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric D strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

18. Bind as desired.
